Call to Order: The Ashland County Health Department Meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm via zoom meeting with all those present.

Approval of Minutes from Last Meeting: 1st - Ron Puglisi, 2nd by Jeff Hardman, motion approved

Environmental Health Division Report: Fielding lots of complaints on COVID-19 issues, social distancing, lots of meetings with businesses, groups, etc. We are doing the same number of activities, just not the normal activities.

Nursing Division Report: We have 17 Total Covid Positive Cases. The nurses are doing infection control in the nursing homes. Overall, we've tracked 800-900 people in our contact tracing. Vaccine clinics are slow.

Health Commissioner Report: Workload on staff – 100% doing COVID response, completed a lot of public health messaging, consultations and on-site visits. ODH has fallen behind on logging numbers on their website.

COVID-19 ODH Funding: \$5000 in March, \$46000 in April, \$21000 in May, \$56697.00 - written documentation for contact tracing (May and June).

Warehouse Gym Update: Closing at 7pm on Friday, May 16, 2020 - did not have to file criminal charges with the court system.

Mohican Young Star Academy: 1 positive case, 7 tested, 4 negatives - could be possible false negatives since patient was sleeping in same space with 3 other roommates and sharing the same space for 2 weeks. The Academy received guidance from Health Department on this matter.

Graduations: Letter going out to schools, could plan for a June graduation.

Old Business: none

New Business:

Sullivan Masonic Lodge request health department approval of an upcoming flower sale. Pat Donaldson replied that the health department was awaiting a letter from Mr. Jim Jeffrey so that the details can be reviewed for approval.

Health Commissioner's Report

Month: May 2020

General Operations:

• Signed contract with Medical Mutual to maintain ACHD's provider status within their Medicaid managed care plan.

 Closed the health department on both Friday, May 22nd and Monday, May 25th in observance of Memorial Day.

Resolved concern of the Ashland Soil and Water Conservation District with regards to reviews
of subdivision properties. ASWCD had requested a formal opinion from the County Prosecutor
on the time requirements allotted to ACHD for review.

Finances:

- 1. Reviewed 2020 budget trends. Projected revenue and expenses for remainder of the year. Identified surplus of funds in the amount of \$63,307.
- 2. Met with County Auditor's office regarding budget and the development of the draft 2021 budget.
- 3. Requested and received \$1,100 in grant funding from the County via the Family and Children First
- 4. Supported grant application for the second component of the COVID-19 grant from the State, \$21,000.

Personal:

- Submitted signed approval for 5 (five) specific team members to receive a one-time payment of \$750.
- Reviewed and approved the release of the COVID-19 Response Specialist position.

Accreditation:

A review of the 2020 budget status, identified that \$55,600 had been allocated to Accreditation expenses. These funds are targeted to be spent by December 31, 2020. Received invoice from Alpha, accreditation consulting group in the amount of \$1,392.04.

Special Projects: COVID-19

Local Policy Decisions made by Commissioner:

- 1. Requested written assistance from the County Prosecutor on whether or not LHD is required to enforce ODH's Orders. Advised that Orders were not 'rules' and therefore there is no legal requirement to enforce the Orders. It was decided, outside of those establishments where we have legal purview, i.e. restaurants, markets, that ACHD will not permit or prohibit an activity from occurring but act as a consultant and advise businesses and organizations on how to reduce risk.
- 2. Reviewed mass testing of LTCFs and discussed with UH Samaritan possibility of conducting testing locally without the National Guard. Decided to put on hold until we hear how this testing is occurring in other parts of the State.
- 3. Drafted a letter to all county high schools regarding graduation ceremonies in response to requests for guidance that discouraged large gatherings the month of May.
- 4. Provided a PPE distribution framework to PHEP Coordinator and EMA that broadened the health care worker and first responder categories to allow for greater distribution among Ashland County facilities.

Ohio Administrative Code 3701-29 Sewage Treatment System Rules

OAC 3701-29-15 General Soil absorption standards:

The general absorption standards set a minimum vertical separation distance, unsaturated in situ soil, permissible effluent quality, and distribution methods.

The required soil evaluation and report describes the location of a limitation in the soil to which the vertical separation distance must be met.

The limiting conditions have a specific vertical separation based on the limitation, i.e. perched seasonal water, restrictive layer, fractured bedrock, groundwater as set by regulation.

The most frequent limitations encountered in Ashland County are perched seasonal water and restrictive layers. The minimum vertical separation is twelve (12") inches to perched seasonal water and eighteen (18") inches to a restrictive layer. The minimum unsaturated in situ soil is eight (8") inches.

A recent soil report received by the H.D. had a perched seasonal water at three (3") inches. This limitation would not meet the vertical separation or in situ soil minimums, even with accepted alternative system designs. I consulted with Ohio Dept of Health and was referred to 3701-29-15(H) which states" A board of health may establish the required minimum vertical separation distance of greater than zero inches and less than six inches, and the required minimum in situ soil thickness within the vertical separation distance of greater than zero inches and less than six inches where the seasonal water table is present and the sewage effluent is pretreated to less than one thousand fecal coliform CFU per one hundred milliliters. The infiltrative surface shall not be placed below the depth of the seasonal water table."

We have not encountered this restrictive limitation before but the adoption of this vertical separation standard by the Board of Health allows the Health Dept. to customize solutions to more restrictive soil conditions that are less prevalent and allows some flexibility that is otherwise not possible.

I respectfully request that the Board of Health adopt the standard described in 3701-29-15(H) as stated above.
