Health Commissioner's Message:

On behalf of the Ashland County Board of Health, Ashland City Board of Health, staff members of the Ashland County-City Health Department, and myself, we are pleased to present the 2016 Annual Report to you—our community members, partners, leaders, volunteers, and supporters. You are the stakeholders in our mission— and we hope that this Annual Report reflects the tremendous community benefit we provide, all thanks to your support.

For nearly 100 years, the Ashland City and Ashland County Health Districts have protected the health of Ashland County residents through preventative clinical care, health promotion services, and collaboration with community partners to improve the health of all residents. These are exciting yet challenging times in public health; over the past year we have faced emerging communicable disease threats, and also continue to fight the ongoing battle against rising opioid abuse in our community. Despite the challenges of the day, the Ashland County-City Health Department remains vigilant in preventing disease and promoting an optimal quality of life for all citizens.

During this past year, I was welcomed into Ashland County as Health Commissioner and was immediately energized by the staff's commitment to protecting and improving public health. We began to look at the work already in motion and assessed our readiness toward state-mandated Public Health Accreditation. Committees were formed to prepare the Strategic Plan, and the Community Health Improvement Plan was completed. Although we are at the beginning stages of preparing for Public Health Accreditation, with the strong community partnerships in place, the innovative approaches we use to solve health issues, and the compassionate and committed staff members using best practices to continuous improve the quality of service provided to all community members, the Ashland County-City Health Department is working to ensure that local public health remains a steadfast presence in the lives of families throughout Ashland County.

The Ashland County-City Health Department is devoted to improving the health and well-being of Ashland County and offers the following services to the community:

Personal Health Services

School Health Services: Hearing, vision, and scoliosis screenings and health resources for teachers and parents.

Public Health Nursing: Head Lice consultations, student intern site, disaster preparedness training, lead case management Children with Medical Handicaps (BCMH): Diagnostic and treatment services for children with medical disabilities

Communicable Disease: Workplace training on Communicable Disease, Case Investigation, education, TB testing and follow up Immunization Clinic: Adult and Pediatric immunization clinics held every Tues(8a-4p)and 4th Monof each month (1-5p).

Offsite seasonal flu clinics.

Ohio Buckles Buckeyes (OBB): Child passenger training for community members and car seats for guardians who meet income criteria

<u>Cribs for Kids</u>: Reducing infant sleep-related deaths and injury by providing safe sleep education and pack n'plays for income eligible families

Environmental Health

<u>Food Protection</u>: Licensure/Inspection of food service operations and retail food establishments to prevent food-borne illness <u>Sewage Treatment</u>: Site review and permits to install/operate sewage treatment systems

Water: Site reviews for new/altered wells, bacteriological and chemical analysis for new and existing wells

Recreational Sanitation: Licensure/Inspection RV parks and camps, public swimming pools and spas

Rabies Control: Investigations of animal bites, enforcement of quarantines, and rabies surveillance

<u>Nuisance Abatement</u>: Investigation of public health nuisance complaints, issue abatement orders, compliance monitoring including housing complaints of public health significance


Solid Waste: Licensure/Inspection of solid waste facilities

<u>Public Health Emergency Preparedness</u>: Development of plans, training, and exercise procedures in response to natural and man-made public health emergencies

<u>Vital Statistics</u>: Maintain accurate records of all births & deaths that occur in Ashland County. Issue birth certificates for anyone born in Ohio and death certificates for person who passed away in Ashland County


